## **Triple Decker Falls**

Location: Wells Gray Provincial Park, British Columbia

**Drive Time from Spahats Creek Resort:** 6 minutes (7.6 km / 4.7 miles)

Parking for RV's: Excellent parking for Rvs and larger vehicles.

**Walking Distance from Spahats Creek Resort:** Not recommended due to the distance and lack of pedestrian pathways.

**Difficulty:** Moderate

Distance of Hike: 3 km (1.9 miles) round trip

**Elevation Change:** Approximately 61 meters (200 feet)

Estimated Hike Time: 1 to 1.5 hours

**Overview:** Triple Decker Falls is a breathtaking three-tiered waterfall nestled within the lush forests of Wells Gray Provincial Park. This hike is perfect for adventurers seeking both stunning views and a serene connection with nature. The trail was upgraded in 2023, providing an improved experience for visitors.

**Drive Description:** From Spahats Creek Resort, drive back to the main entrance and turn left (west) onto Spahats Creek Road for 600 meters (0.3 miles). Turn left (south) onto Clearwater Valley Road and continue for 7 km (4.3 miles). Look for the parking area for Triple Decker Falls on your right, marked with a clear trailhead sign.

## **Hike Description:**

- 1. Begin at the newly updated trailhead and follow the well-marked path through the forest.
- 2. The trail gently descends to a fork. Take the left path, which leads you to the base of Triple Decker Falls. Here, you'll be rewarded with a spectacular view of the cascading three tiers.
- 3. If you wish to explore further, the trail continues beyond the falls, connecting to Candle Creek Falls or the Clearwater River Trail, which can lead all the way to the town of Clearwater.
- 4. Return via the same trail for a total round trip of 3 km (1.9 miles).

## Tips:

- Wear sturdy hiking shoes, as the trail includes some uneven terrain.
- Bring water and snacks; there are no facilities along the trail.
- The best times to visit are in the morning or late afternoon for cooler temperatures and ideal lighting for photos.

**Summary:** Triple Decker Falls is a scenic and moderately challenging hike that rewards visitors with close-up views of a majestic three-tiered waterfall. With connections to other trails for extended adventures, this attraction is a highlight of Wells Gray Provincial Park and a convenient excursion from Spahats Creek Resort.
